

Lodge Application Form

Arrowmen Conservation School (ACS) is designed to provide lodge-level youth officers with the knowledge and training required to develop and execute a localized *ArrowCorps* project. ACS will also provide adult advisors with support-related training to assist youth in mobilizing the necessary resources for project planning and execution. This program is intended for lodges that **aim to develop a council-based conservation initiative**, as such admission to ACS will be granted based on the information provided regarding a potential project. Once you have completed this form, you will need to return it via US mail or email. ACS is currently accepting lodge applications for admission to the program – your lodge team <u>must consist of two (2) youth and one (1) adult</u>. If more then fifty (50) applications are received admission selections will be made in conjunction with section leadership.
